Regulatory Environment

Regulation 913/2010: The management board shall set up an advisory group made up of managers and owners of the terminals of the freight corridor including, where necessary, sea and inland waterway ports. This advisory group may issue an opinion on any proposal by the management board which has direct consequences for investment and the management of terminals. It may also issue own-initiative opinions. The management board shall take any of these opinions into account. In the event of disagreement between the management board and the advisory group, the latter may refer the matter to the executive board. The executive board shall act as an intermediary and provide its opinion in due time. The final decision however shall be taken by the management board





Opinions

- The Corridor 2 management board will establish a list of all the terminals belonging to Corridor 2
- The Transport Market Study will be an important source of information to establish this list
- All terminals that we believe to <u>potentially</u> be a "Corridor 2 terminal" have been invited today
- We value the diversity of your opinions

- Our intention is to collect all opinions on any given topic

Regulation and terminals

- Compliance to regulation requires data or information from terminals
 - terminal development plans (art 9.4); deadline: 3/2013
 - allocation of capacity and access to terminals (art 14.9)
 - coordination between the operation of the railway infrastructure and the terminals (art 16.2)
 - characteristics of terminals, in particular information concerning the conditions and methods of accessing the terminals (art 18.b)
 - rail freight services performance (art 19.2)



Regulation and terminals

On May 22, 2012, the European Commission suggested, among other indicators, the following items for the rail freight services performance monitoring scheme

Intermodal terminals	Marshalling yards
Nr of trains handled	Nr of wagons handled
Ready-for-departure time (delays)	Average dwell time
Ready-for-unloading time (delays)	Ready-for-departure time (delays)
