A French banker born in Frankfort am Main, antidemocrat, antirepublican, financing the Great-Britain war against Napoleon, he became an iconic character of novels of no less than 3 great French writers: Stendhal in Lucien Leuwen, Balzac in la Comédie humaine and Zola in l'Argent.

French people grow fond of him when he founds the Lafite-Rothschild Bordeaux house wine in 1868






Rothschild Room: the Management Board Meeting Room of La compagnie des Chemins de Fer du Nord

The Compagnie des chemins de fer du Nord operates the North part of France and a part of Benelux from 1845 to 1938. It is created by banker James de Rothschild and his partners.
