Gathering of terminal data for the Corridor Information Document



Fast track your rail freight

1. Overview

Article 18(b) of Regulation 913/2010 states the following:

The management board (thus the Corridor) shall draw up, regularly update and publish a document containing:

(b) the list and characteristics of terminals, in particular information concerning the conditions and methods of accessing the terminals;

This document will be called the Corridor Information Document and will consist out of 5 books. The third book will contain the information that is mentioned in the above mentioned article of the Regulation.

Since the Corridor does not have this information at the moment, we ask the terminals if they could make this information available, to allow us to comply with the Regulation.



2. Corridor Strategy

RFC 1 and **RFC 2** have agreed on a common strategy on how to publish the Terminal information in our respective Corridor Information Documents (CID)

- > A common template is proposed to our respective TAGs
- We ask the terminals in question to make the information, asked in the template, available on their terminal websites
- The Corridor will provide direct hyperlinks to these web pages in the respective chapter (Book III) of the Corridor Information Document

Advantages:

- The terminal remains 100% in control of the information provided
- Updates can be assured without delay or misunderstandings
