A milestone for rail freight transport in Europe

Seventeen years after the first blasting cycle for the main gallery, the longest rail tunnel in the world will soon be ready to come into operation.

On 1 June 2016, the Gotthard Base tunnel will be officially opened. Scheduled operation will begin on 11 December 2016.

With the construction of the level route through the Alps, Switzerland is writing a new chapter in transport history. Between the first drawing for a base tunnel between Amsteg in the canton of Uri and Bodio in the canton of Ticino in 1947 and the start of construction in 1999, the plans had to be revised several times. The recession in the 1970s and the debate about the different variants delayed the start of the construction project of the century. But the hard work and the discussions have now paid off. The result is an epoch-making structure with broad popular support and sustainable financing.

The economy and the population of the whole of Europe will benefit from the level route under the Gotthard. The tunnel will allow longer, heavier trains with fewer locomotives to operate on the north-south route and will shorten journey times. This will improve the efficiency and reliability of rail freight transport and the railways will become more competitive. In addition, the transport capacity will increase. A total of up to 260 scheduled freight trains can pass through the Gotthard Base Tunnel every day. The maximum figure on the existing mountain route is 180 trains.

Welcome to a new era of rail freight transport in Europe! I am confident that the EU member states will also achieve their transport policy objectives. If rail transport is given the right priority in Europe as well, we will all be winners.
