2. What's new on the corridor:

- See Presentation 2 made by G. Confais-Morieux (GCM).
- On the point 'Situation RFC Rhine-Alpine with the Rastatt tunnel':
 - o GCM gave a state of play concerning the handling of the Rastatt incident.
- On the point 'Contacts with stakeholders in the UK:
 - o GCM gave a state of play concerning the meeting between the RFC NSM, the EC and Transport for London, on 14th of September 2017.
 - o RFC NSM welcomed the intervention of Lord Berkeley of GB Rail Freight Group by way of a letter sent to London authorities that support the vision of RFC NSM on that topic.
- On the point 'Integration Geneva & discussion with Marseille port authorities':
 - GCM explained that RFC NSM integrated Geneva into the catalog, but no PaP's are proposed in the upcoming TT.
- On the point 'Evolution CIP in the RFC NSM website':
 - o The Multi Corridor view of the Customer Information Platform can be consulted by clicking here.
- Following point was added by E.Lambert:
 - o He informed the attendance of the 'Ferrmed' meeting in Marseille on the 12th of December;
- GCM gave an oral state of play concerning the ERTMS Deployment Action Plan, see presentation 3.3.2.

3. Action plan following previous RAG

- On Action 2 and 5: See presentation 3.1: Feedback TT 2018 & Strategy TT 2019 made by T. Vanbeveren;
 - A. M. Penso asks if the proposed strategy will also have an impact on the actual stability of the PaP. T Vanbeveren and C Hamoniau point out that the new approach on how to publish and manage PaP requests is aimed at solving the problem of incorrect information in PCS, and thus different information in PCS and the national system. Especially, but not solely, this was a problem for France for TT2018, because of a malfunction of the interface between Gesico and PCS. Getting the correct information in PCS enables the C-OSS to coordinate and oversee the path construction, enforcing proper coordination at the borders, if necessary

- Concerning 'ERTMS: situation in Luxemburg': see presentation 3.3.1 made by M. Salimène:



- E. Lambert points out that the RU's will not have enough traction engines if there is no change in deadline dates due to issues regarding the software implementation by their suppliers on the traction engines. This will have repercussions on the Corridor.
- Concerning 'ERTMS Deployment Action Plan Feedback': see presentation 3.3.2 made by M. Salimène:
 - RU's were asked by M. Salimène and the chair of the RAG to formulate their feedback on the DAP before the foreseen meeting of the 27th of September and the ExBo meeting of the 5th of October where the ERTMS Coordinator is invited.
- Concerning 'CNC & ERTMS coordinators invitation in October 2017': <u>see presentation 3.3.3</u> made by M.
 Salimène:
 - o RU's were asked by GCM, the chair of the RAG and the chair of the ExBo (P.Bodieux) to formulate additional topics for the meeting of the 5th of October.
- On Action 9: <u>See presentation 3.4</u> made by M. Salimène:
 - o N. Czernecki states clearly that failing is not an option on that topic;
 - o In response, G. de Mol points out that the focus must be train run blocking factors on deviation routes.
